

# VectorFibre InterNet

## Acceptable Use Policy

This acceptable use policy ("Policy") applies to anyone provided with the VectorFibre InterNet service ("you" or "your") by Vector Communications Limited ("we", "us" or "our"). By using and/or distributing our VectorFibre InterNet service ("Service"), you agree to comply with this Policy.

If you make the Service available to your customers, you will also ensure that your customers comply with this Policy, and incorporate terms that are the same or similar to this Policy into your agreement with those customers.

We may change this Policy at any time by providing you with 30 days written notice and posting the new policy on our website. Your continued use of the Service after posting any such changes indicates your acceptance of those changes. When you are notified of any change in the Policy by us, you will ensure that those changes are reflected in the agreement between you and your customers.

You agree not to use, or allow any other person (including your customers) to use, the Service in any way that is illegal or causes damage or harm to others. This includes (but is not limited to):

- sending unsolicited electronic mail to any person for the purpose of advertising or promoting any organisation (spamming);
- infringing our, or any other party's, intellectual property rights, including by distributing copyright material;
- using or distributing the personal information of others in any way without their consent;
- any use of the Service that is offensive to others, including using inappropriate language or expressions of bigotry or hatred;
- engaging in harassment, whether through language, frequency, or size of messages;
- attempting to gain unauthorised access to any system, network or account belonging to us or another person (hacking);
- attempting to intercept, interfere with or deny the Service to any another person;
- introducing or sending anything harmful or destructive (such as viruses, worms, Trojan Horses, time bombs or bots) to our or anyone else's computer system or communications services;
- engaging in any fraudulent activity, such as the use of a false identity, hiding the source of the message, or making the source appear to be someone else; and
- using the Service in any way that encourages another person to breach the prohibitions covered under this Policy.

You are responsible for all your activities while using the Service, and it is your responsibility to maintain the security of your personal information and the personal information of your customers. We are not responsible for the security of your network, any information you or your customers post while using the Service, or any content you or your customers may view over the Internet.
